Prerequisite

This is a **beginner's level course**. That means, we suppose you have no background or a little bit background.

Learning objectives - What is my goal and objectives of taking this course?

This course is your first crucial strides to Mandarin Chinese. Establish a solid foundation of your Chinese journey. Switching from Latin alphabet or other phonogram languages to Chinese could be intimidating and frustrating. This prerequisite course breaks down all basic characteristics of Chinese language, ensuring you have a solid foundation to be a competent speaker.

Course Description

In each lesson, we introduce one Chinese characteristic with practices and related dialogues. By the end of this course, you will be ready to further your knowledge in Chinese. You will learn five essential characteristics of Mandarin Chinese: tones, pinyin, Chinese characters, one character one syllable, basic Chinese structures.

Pacing - How should I plan my learning schedule?
